

Message from the CEO and Chair

While the year appears to have passed quickly, some may say that the road to post-pandemic and post-flood recovery has been slower than anticipated and, in some instances, not as comprehensive as it needed to be. For example, there continues to be a range of housing challenges in the Rochester area, with some houses fully repaired while neighbouring houses remain an empty shell, a testament to the damage that was sustained during the floods and a clear picture of what still needs to be done. C4EM continues to see a need for ongoing support of our local businesses and the community that sustains them. This support is needed not only in times of disaster but in an ongoing manner during times of recovery.

With Deanne Armstrong stepping down earlier this year, the board identified that for the organisation to fulfill its potential membership and project delivery, that a strategic-thinking CEO would be needed to continue to build on our vision and commercial focus, and we welcomed Chris Janson onboard in February.

Chris' drive and enthusiasm has seen him quickly become involved in several comprehensive issues in the region including:

• The draft Echuca Moama Flood Study Report, which is currently open for comments and is the first part of the Echuca Moama Torrumbarry Flood Study and Risk Management Plan Project. The second part of the project will follow in 2024.

• The Echuca Safe Towns Sub-committee and implementing CCTV and safety measures in the CBD.

• A partnership with Committee for Greater Shepparton to attract investment and employment opportunities through regionalbased opportunities in food and fibre production.

• Recognised at the Climate and Leadership Jobs Summit as the lead go-to agency for renewable energy in our region.

• Water security under the Water Amendment (Restoring our Rivers) Bill 2023 which, if passed will reintroduce water buybacks and remove the requirement to consider the social and economic impacts of purchasing water from irrigators.

Late last year, C4EM submitted and was successful in a funding application to provide a well-being event to locals affected by the recent floods. Tickets to the event were snapped up within the first 48 hours, demonstrating the need for such community support. The event was held in June this year, and survey results pointed to 100% of attendees scoring the event with a 7 out of 10 or higher (70% of attendees rating the event as 10/10).



With the support of local businesses in mind, C4EM conducted free informational breakfasts for members on the topics of internet connectivity, and later in the year, renewable energy. At both events, C4EM were able to provide relevant and knowledgeable speakers who clearly demonstrated the importance of these topics in doing business in the current environment, including providing local examples.

In continuing support for local business and our members, C4EM has been successful in applying for a \$20,000 grant to provide a presentation, half-day workshop and one-on-one financial consultations for flood-affected businesses in the region. The current plan is to kick off these events early in the new year in Rochester.

Here at C4EM, we see an important part of our role to be as relevant as possible to our members, which means actively listening to the concerns and challenges of businesses in the region. A consistent message has been the difficulties associated with attracting and retaining suitable staff. As such, one of the major endeavours we have been working on is the Community Connector project, which has been facilitated in partnership with Echuca Regional Health several workshops through and local organisations and presentations, with community representation.

Moving forward, we see it as important to develop and expand our membership and continue to organise relevant events with a focus on the community and local businesses.


Committees for Cities & Regions Overview



Participants learned about the rollout of the nbn network in the region and what they can expect from the service.

Nbn representatives and community engagement managers Michelle Cobb and Andrew Cottrill spoke about the upgrades taking place over the next two years which will enhance the capabilities of the business, medical and education sector.

The delivery phase will add an extra 120,000 customers to the fixed wireless network and range from fixed wireless towers will extend from 14km to 29km which will cover many more people.

Let's Talk Renewables

Committee for Echuca Moama hosted a Renewables Breakfast at Radcliffe's which looked at energy prices, an overview of the Victorian and NSW electricity market and initiatives to help achieve cheaper, more efficient and renewable outcomes.

The morning was run by Dr lain Jennings from lcircle, a specialist energy management firm who helped Mawsons Concrete and Quarries become the first concrete and quarry business in Australia to switch to 100 per cent renewable energy.

At the moment, renewable energy is about 4c/kilowatt hour more expensive than fossil fuels, but lock-in contracts of three years can still provide good value for money, according to lain, and it is particularly attractive for businesses who have budgeted on using renewable energy and the upside is their green status is more attractive to customers and banks.
